Brent Marshall shows his true colours.

"Marshall believes developers have superior rights in deciding Halton's future", states Brian Burton, Candidate for Regional Chair who promises to stand up for Halton home owners.

Halton - Oakville: Last week, in an interview with Oakville Today, [Brent Marshall](#) responded to fellow Regional Chair of Halton candidate [Brian Burton's](#) challenge not to accept donations from developers during this municipal election.

Marshall said, ".developers are as essential to this community as anyone else and have as much right, more so maybe, to be at the table."

In other words, Mr. Marshall thinks that developers have a superior right when important decisions are being made on behalf of the residents of Halton Region.

"I stand for homeowners and ratepayers. Period," says Brian Burton. "Brent Marshall has his priorities backwards. I will put people first. Developers do not donate to political campaigns out of kindness. They expect a return - special access and favours."

There are many companies waiting in the wings for the chance to participate in Mr. Marshall's \$127 million Taj MaHalton complex. A project that will tear down a relatively new complex that is perfectly functional.

Supporters of the Taj MaHalton concept initially claimed it would save \$20 million per year. Six months later the savings estimates have fallen to only \$12 million.

"Based on 11 years working as a senior executive in the contracting business and knowing that all government overhead projects are underestimated, I have a prediction," says Brian.

"If the Taj MaHalton is not stopped, the final cost will be \$200 million and the savings will be zero. In fact the costs will be up."

Brian Burton's plan calls for putting the brakes on the Taj MaHalton project and directing the funding towards services and reduced taxes.

The Brian Burton campaign is about protecting Halton's quality of life, implementing Halton's growth plan in a way that protects the integrity of the natural environment, lower taxes and good management.

"My goal as Regional Chair is to deliver on these goals by providing committed, experienced, strong leadership for the people of Halton," concludes Brian.
