Chudleigh announces; he'll run in the riding of Halton

Halton - Halton Hills: Ted Chudleigh said today that he will run for re-election in the provincial riding of Halton in the next provincial election slated for October, 2007.

The boundaries of the riding of Halton will alter substantially when the election is called, as the province will mirror changes across most of Ontario that have been adopted by the federal government.

The riding of Halton is being split. The Town of Halton Hills will be joining much of Wellington County in the new riding of Wellington - Halton Hills. Halton riding will consist of Milton and much of north Oakville and north east Burlington.

"I have decided to seek the Progressive Conservative nomination in the new riding of Halton, and if successful, I will run for the seat in the new riding of Halton," said Mr. Chudleigh. "Given that I currently represent the vast majority of residents of the new riding of Halton it seems proper that I pursue that course in my re-election bid. The new riding of Wellington - Halton Hills consists of a large number of residents which I have not previously represented."

Mr. Chudleigh said he feels a great affinity for Halton Hills and is particularly saddened by the break up of the current riding, although he did say he understands the need to reorganize the riding boundaries due to substantial population growth.

"I would like to assure all residents of Halton Hills that I will faithfully execute my duties as their representative until such time as the Legislature is dissolved," he said. "I would like to acknowledge the support of the people of Halton Hills over the years. It is a community that will continue to remain near and dear to me."
